




LEGION HANDBOOK REVISITED

Prohibition of Material Relief in the Legion

Chapter 39 , Point 10 pp 291.



In pursuing its spiritual mission, the Legion of Mary upholds a vital principle that separates its activities from material aid, even in the smallest forms. This includes the provision of used clothing, which is also categorized as material aid. The Legion does not dismiss the importance of giving aid, but asserts that this practice is impractical for the organization.

****Why does the Legion not provide material aid?****

- 1. **Public Perception:** Visits from an organization that provides material aid are often unwelcome by those who do not need aid. They worry about being perceived as receiving material benefits by their neighbours.
 - 2. **Expectations and Disappointment:** Those who anticipate aid and do not receive it can become disappointed and closed off to the Legion's influence.
- 3. **Focus on Spiritual Aid:** Even though the Legion encounters cases of poverty and need during visits, its primary task is to spread spiritual goodness, not material aid.

The Legion of Mary acknowledges and respects the work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, which focuses on material aid. However, the Legion has a different calling, which is to spread spiritual goodness to every individual.

****Allowed Forms of Help:****

While the Legion does not provide material aid, its members are not prohibited from showing care. The Legion encourages that if members wish to provide aid, they should do so anonymously through an agency or third party to avoid complications and ensure that the aid is not associated with Legion activities.

The Legion also urges its members to remain sensitive to the needs around them and engage other organizations more suited to handling the type of need in question. Thus, the Legion remains focused on its spiritual mission while demonstrating genuine concern for community needs.




This trip not only strengthened bonds but also showcased the global reach and unified spirit of the Legion, inspiring all members to live and share their faith actively.
