Dear brother and sisters,

Today, let's think about a special verse from *Ephesians 5:2: "Live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us."* This verse, isn't just beautiful—it asks us to show deep love through our actions.

True love means doing something, not just feeling it. It might be as simple as saying hello to someone we've met in tough times or sharing a meal in a modest home. These small actions show big love.

Real love faces challenges. Avoiding tough moments can make our friendships seem shallow. But when we embrace these challenges, we truly show our love.

Remember, loving like Jesus means giving without limits. He asks us if we're ready to give it all, just like he did. Our actions prove our love.






As members of the Legion of Mary, let us strive to embody St. Joseph's virtues and open our hearts to his powerful, protective love.
